- 1. SET STEERING TO STRAIGHT.
- 2. RAISE VEHICLE.
- 3. REMOVE REAR WHEEL FROM THE APPLICABLE SIDE BEING REPLACED. (FIGURE 1)

5. IN THE REAR CARGO AREA, REMOVE ALL APPLICABLE TRIM PANELS TO GAIN ACCESS TO THE UPPER SHOCK MOUNTING FASTENERS. REFERENCE MANUFACTURE'S INSTRUCTIONS FOR REMOVAL OF INTERIOR PANELLING (FIGURES 3, 4)

7. DISCONNECT THE SHOCKS DAMPING SOLENOID ELECTRICAL CONNECTOR, LOCATED JUST BEHIND THE SHOCK, ON THE CONTROL ARM. (FIGURE 7)

Tighten all nuts and bolts to manufacturer's specifications during the installation process.

1. INSTALL THE REPLACEMENT SHOCK, SOLENOID SIDE OUT. (FIGURE 9)
